 Inhalte The seminar focuses on the United Nations by taking a practical approach: Students will participate in two international Model United Nations Conferences. One will take place in November in Karlsruhe and the other one will be in spring (exact date tba) in Italy, France, the Netherlands or Spain.
 During the seminar sessions students will prepare to represent a specific country in one of the UN bodies. This preparation includes:
 • gaining an understanding of the functioning of the different UN bodies
 • researching one country's foreign policy stance
 • preparing position papers on the topics to be discussed during the conferences
 • working on debating and presentation skills
 Times:
 • weekly sessions wednesday 12:00-14:00 (c.t.) - not every wednesday, but regularly
 • tba: one longer session for a debating workshop
 • 18.-20.11.22 KAMUN (Karlsruhe)
 • tba: 3/4-day MUN conference in february/march/april 2023
 Lernziele After several covid-semesters when seminars were mostly taking place online, this one aims to bring international politics to life and to strengthen related skills.

Inhalte	This seminar explores the various aspects of inequality and equality. It provides the students with an overview of theories, concepts and measurement problems of inequality. A special emphasis will be given on special aspects such as gender, migration, intergenerational aspects, health and education. Also classical subjects like income and wealth will be discussed.
Lernziele	<p>Class requirements:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Active participation: 20% 2. Each Student is responsible for the presentation of the texts in one class room session: 20% 3. Four Homework Assignments (out of 8) with questions to the texts (4-5 pages for each assignment): 60%. The questions will focus on the required readings. The assignments have to be submitted in the corresponding class. <p>All required readings will be available as pdf documents. Growing Economic Inequality? Piketty and his critique 11. Migration and Inequality 12. Inequality and Racial and Ethnic Inequality 13. Corona Pandemic and Inequality
