Inhalte	The course is divided into three parts. The first introduces the subject and examines the core elements of traditional global governance: international and regional organizations as well as its institutional and legal foundations, such as the United Nations, regional organizations in Africa, and international regimes to protect the environment and mitigate climate change. The second part surveys emerging trends in contemporary global governance. Students will be introduced to the increasingly important role of non-state actors and global civil society, the shift of authority from nation states to global governance institutions and actors, and the expansion of international law and judicialization. The proliferation of international and regional human rights institutions, promoted by non-state actors, is a case in point. The third part explores current challenges in global governance. Students will learn about the (lack of) legitimacy and legitimation strategies of global governance institutions as well as regime complexes and overlaps that arise from the multitude of actors and institutions in several policy fields.

Zielgruppe	The course is aimed at advanced BA students who have acquired basic knowledge of International Relations and international organizations.
Empfehlung	As global interdependence grows, structures of international and transnational governance are becoming ever more complex. This course provides an overview of processes and variable outcomes in global governance. In the framework of this course, the students will become familiar with competing perspectives on globalization and global governance, the sources and consequences of global power and authority, as well as the key actors, institutions, regimes, and norms of global governance. Finally, the course also explores possible ways of improving the capacity of the international community as a whole to deal with global challenges. Throughout, the course addresses diverse empirical cases, how and why processes differ across different issue areas as well as ways in which global governance might be reformed to produce better outcomes. These cases deal with, inter alia, how to realize human rights, address environmental problems and climate change, resolve health emergency situations and regulate finance at the regional and global level.

Inhalte The seminar focuses on the United Nations by taking a practical approach: Students will participate in one or two international Model United Nations Conferences. One will take place in May in Maastricht and the other one will probably happen in Freiburg towards the end of the semester.

During the seminar sessions students will prepare to represent a specific country in one of the UN bodies. This preparation includes:

- gaining an understanding of the functioning of the different UN bodies
- researching one country's foreign policy stance
- preparing position papers on the topics to be discussed during the conferences
- working on debating and presentation skills

Times:

- sessions on Tuesdays (not every week, but regularly. normally 16-18, but 02.05+09.05.23, we will do a double session from 16-20)
- tba: one longer session for a debating workshop
- 18.-21.05.2023: EUROMUN Maastricht
- tba: 2nd MUN Conference

Lernziele

	After several covid-semesters when seminars were mostly taking place online, this one aims to bring international politics to life and to strengthen related skills. Students will <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• participate in two international MUN conferences</li> <li>• gain practical insights regarding the functioning of the UN</li> <li>• work on their presentation and rhetorical skills</li> <li>• learn to work out and defend arguments in English</li> <li>• improve their intercultural competences</li> <li>• gain experience regarding project management</li> </ul>
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Zwingende Voraussetzung Obligatory prerequisites:

- Fluency in written and spoken English (at least B2, preferably higher!)
- High Motivation to participate in Model United Nations Conferences

Beware that **this seminar is rather time-consuming** and demands a lot of initiative. Please do only apply for the seminar, if you are willing to spend two of your normally free weekends at MUN conferences.

Empfohlene Voraussetzung Recommended prerequisite:

- Basic knowledge on international organizations, for example from taking the IR introductory lecture
