Course Description	This course considers diplomacy as a professional activity. Origins and development of professional diplomacy – messengers, envoys, missions and embassies, as well as ministries of foreign affairs, their tasks and duties, principles and tools – are introduced to the students on the material of not only European, but also Eastern tradition. We look at diplomatic practices from the beginnings of Middle-Eastern civilization until the 21 st century. A role-play simulation of the international conference at Algeciras in 1906 is organized between the first and the second parts of the course. Your preparation for this simulation will include research on a historic character, relevant for the Conference, his background, the state and interests of his country. Some readings for the course will be in French, German, Spanish and Russian (Italian is a possibility), therefore, good knowledge of one of these languages is an asset. High motivation is necessary: students who consider leaving this course in the middle are strongly discouraged from taking part, since this will influence the quality of the simulation and of the experience for other students. Students, who are unsure about participation, are welcome to contact the instructor beforehand. Preference in this course will be given to Governance and Culture and History students. Also students who take <i>History of European Diplomacy</i> in Block III get privileged access to the course.
