Situation for new Incoming ERASMUS+ students

Current situation

- Our university is currently open, though many of our learning and teaching activities are still limited or have moved to online learning. Most lectures in the winter term will be held from November 02, 2020, to February 13, 2021. Please note that there is an earlier start for some subjects and courses. Please stay in contact with your <u>Freiburg departmental coordinators</u> to get the up-to-date information about your semester plans and keep yourself informed on our <u>website</u>.
- Please also note that our office is currently closed to the public, but we are still available via e-mail and by phone.

Your application and switching semesters

- Applications for the summer term 2021 are open until November 30, 2020. Should you wish to change your semester from the winter to the summer term, please have your coordinator at home nominate you again for the summer semester.
- If you wish to switch semesters or cancel your mobility, please also notify us via e-mail to europa@zv.uni-freiburg.de.
- Should you have notified us that you wished to cancel your mobility, but have now decided to come to Freiburg after all, please write us an e-mail as soon as possible to *europa* @zv.uni-freiburg.de.

Preparations before arrival/matriculation

- For questions concerning courses and alternative teaching activities, you should contact your respective departmental coordinator. A <u>list</u> with the contact information of all coordinators is sent to you with your welcome mail and is available online.
